- At the outbreak of a civil war, his family fled Liberia moving to the United States where he had the opportunity to study fine art, sculptures and graphic design
- Influenced by Italian artist Leonardo da Vinci, American illustrator Norman Rockwell and American artist Ernie Barnes, he began to push the boundaries on the evolution of art and creativity
- Growing up with customary African values in a westernized American culture, his art merges the traditional with the technological
- Cooper's signature mixed medium, acrylic style is quickly emerging in the contemporary art scene
 - The unique style has attracted several celebrity clients
 - o Private collectors both nationally and internationally have acquired his work
- The fine art collection Heroes reimagines the heroes of Black History and Pop Culture, casting famous role models in an exciting new light
 - Black "shereos" Harriet Tubman, Sojourner Truth, Rosa Parks and Winnie Mandela in t-shirts bearing the insignias of Superman, Green Lantern, Iron Man and Black Panther respectively
 - Connecting these freedom fighters with the visual symbolism of superheroes makes a powerful statement
- The Fame series features Kanye West in multi-color acrylic portraits, reminiscent of Andy Warhol's photographic silkscreens
- Dedicated to distinctive figures in Pop Culture, his *Purple* series features Rihanna, Janelle Monáe and Grace Jones
- Celebrity culture is often the center of the artist's work. His blend of vibrant colors mixed with history and pop culture have been featured in exhibits nationwide and attracted celebrity fans
- Cooper states "I'm not just an artist, I'm a creator... Each Individual piece has a conversation with the viewer's soul, provokes thought, changes the narrative and inspires you to evolve. It's all about evolution."
